**Appendix 1: Means of Publication**

**Part 1:** publication for laws, regulations, judicial decisions and administrative rulings of general application, and procedures, including standard contract clauses:

**Part 2:** Notice of intended procurement (open tendering) will be published in Arabic in the following means of publication:

- Official gazette, *Umm Al-Qura*
- Two local newspapers
- On the procuring entity website

**Appendix 2: Notice of Intended Procurement**

A procuring entity shall include the following information in each notice of intended procurement:

- (a) The name of the procuring entity.
- (b) The tender's number and its description.
- (c) Classification field and price of tender documentation
- (d) The time frame and place for submitting and opening tenders.

**Appendix 3: Minimum Information**

The following is required for any supplier to be included in the Classification list:

- (a) Submission of classification application to the Deputy Ministry of Municipal and Rural Affairs for Contractors Classification with all required documentation.
- (b) After completing all required information, the Department of Contractors Classification will start classifying supplier.

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- (c) Deputy Ministry for Contractors Classification will issue a certificate of classification valid for 3 years.
- (d) The list of classified contractors will be available on the website of the Deputy Ministry for Contractors Classification.
